## Fern Class

What a great week we have had in Lealholm! We enjoyed our art lesson, collaging using natural materials. We have been inspired by the work of Andy Goldsworthy and his natural style of sculpture. We have also finished publishing our letters to Rishi Sunak about deforestation and we look forward to posting these next week!

## **Heather Class**

The children are thoroughly enjoying the award-winning class text this half term and we are looking forward to writing our own third person narrative based on the events in the novel, in the next couple of weeks. After collecting and compiling all their information about biomes, the children successfully planned, drafted and published their non-chronological reports about biomes. It was fantastic to see how much knowledge the children had remembered and the fascinating facts they have found out about each of them.

In maths, the year 3 children have been working extremely hard this week on their unit on fractions. They have been finding fractions of set objects and applying their knowledge to reasoning questions. The year 4 children continue to show their fantastic mathematical knowledge by applying their recent work on decimals to apply to the unit on money. They were able to complete some rather tricky problem solving





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activities. We have been very impressed with the year 5 children and how they have worked well as a group to work through questions about angles and are showing a secure understanding on this work so far, they are now able to use a protractor to draw a given angle. The year 6's have shown an excellent understanding in their algebra unit and have been able to apply their knowledge to reasoning and problem solving activities.

The children were very excited to start the history topic for the half term which is local mining. During the first lesson, children were learning about what mining is, what the benefits are and the impact. We were thoroughly impressed with the children's prior knowledge about this. The children created some great information texts about this.

## **Quad Kids**

The Y3/4 children had a fun packed afternoon on Thursday. Working very hard demonstrating their skills in 50m sprint, 400m distance run, standing long jump and throwing the howler. Despite the cold miserable weather, they managed to get all 4 activities recorded. The afternoon finished with a few games of dodge ball in the sports hall, which was lots of fun and enjoyed by all. A big well done to the children for outstanding behaviour and performance.
